



What Vaccines should people with a Learning Disability have this winter?

Flu Vaccine

All people with a Learning Disability should be invited for the Flu vaccine. Flu is serious for people with a learning disability. Make sure people are protected. If injections are difficult, those with a learning disability can ask for a nasal spray.

Covid-19 Vaccine

This winter the COVID-19 vaccine is being offered only to those people with a learning disability who are:

- Aged 75 years and over
- Live in care homes for older adults (not learning disability homes)
- Immunosuppressed (check with their GP)

Pneumococcal Vaccine

All people with a learning disability should be considered for a Pneumococcal vaccine because they fall into the risk group of Neurological conditions. People with a Learning Disability are at higher risk of pneumonia and sepsis. This is a one-off injection, not one they will need every year (Ask their GP).
